Water-Proof Electronics of the Wayne Ovation™ Fuel Dispenser

Many design elements of the Wayne Ovation^{™2} fuel dispenser are easy to recognize such as the white-on-black LCD price display, the card reader and pin-pad inside the electronic head, the 25% more branding space, and the added stainless steel. However, there are quality improvements that are not as visible but are just as important – specifically, the water-proofing improvements made to the Ovation² dispenser's electronic head that houses payment terminals, displays, soft-keys, push-to-start (PTS) panel, and other important circuitry.

Here are a few ways in which Wayne designed the Ovation² dispenser to protect the electronics from water and moisture:

- Each Ovation² dispenser bezel is cut to reflect the customer's exact electronics configuration, creating a form-fitting barrier (versus using a one-size-fits-all frame).
- The second way to prevent water intrusion is creating a protective seal around the bezel. The Ovation² fuel dispenser bezel seals are manufactured using neoprene rubber gaskets. These seals are applied to the payment electronics, as well as the PTS panel.
- Wayne subjected Ovation² fuel dispensers to more rigorous testing methods than previous-generation Ovation dispensers. For example, the dispenser faced more direct water and higher pressures of water than ever before. Wayne achieved ULapproval, but also IPx5-approval - a regulatory approval which had never been achieved before in Ovation dispensers.

Get Ready For Contactless Payments.

Report predicts that frequency of contactless payments will grow by 100% this year.

As Apple Pay adoption continues, more shoppers are using contactless payments to purchase items in stores, according to a new report issued from market researcher Juniper Research. Contactless payments let shoppers wave their mobile phone in front of a reader at the cash register to make a payment. Their credit card is automatically billed without them having to take it out of their wallet.

As Fortune writes this week, Juniper Research says that the number of mobile wallets using contactless technology is expected to reach 200 million by the end of 2016, up 100% from the end of 2014. This estimate affirms earlier statements from Apple CEO Tim Cook, who has said that Apple Pay will be accepted by 1.5 million locations in the United States by the end of this year.

What's more, says Fortune, the launch of Apple Pay has helped spur the overall growth in contactless payments over the past year, as Google debuted its contactless mobile payments technology, Android Pay, earlier this year and is expected to roll the service out broadly in the next few weeks. Another platform for the technology, CurrentC- developed by the Merchant Customer Exchange (MCX), a group of merchants including some convenience retailers – is also in the works but has not yet officially launched. – www.nacsonline.com

Safety Tips:

Gas Pumps can be Easy Targets for Fraudsters

Gas stations have become vulnerable to skimming devices that illegally capture consumers' credit or debit card information from the card's magnetic strip to create counterfeit cards.

In Florida alone, 127 skimmers were found at its gas stations this year, reported PalmBeachPost.com.

They have also been found for the first time in California, according to Steven Scarince, a Los Angeles-based U.S. Secret Service agent.

Making illegal purchases using counterfeit card is easier to carry out in gas stations as they are usually unattended.

Counterfeit cards are also used by thieves to fill up "bladder

trucks", tanks hidden inside the vehicle and can contain hundreds of gallons of gas, which will then be sold to fly-by-night gas stations or construction sites, according to a Dow Jones News Service report.

The report further said that the gas station industry lost approximately \$250 million while the card industry lost around \$500 million on fuel-related fraud in 2013.

In response to this, gas stations have been beefing up their security by putting up fraud-proof equipment. However, tighter measures coming from Visa and MasterCard won't be applicable to gas stations until 2017.

Card payments account to more than 50% of all gas purchases in the U.S., according to California-based Nilson Report.
